In 2025, the Körös Consortium and the Vésztő-Mágor Conservation and Exhibition Program will offer two opportunities for students to participate in archaeological fieldwork in Hungary. These projects are primarily funded by the National Science Foundation (NSF) and the Foundation for the Study and Preservation of Tells (FSPT), and co-directed by Drs. Attila Gyucha, Danielle Riebe, and William Ridge. Four to six students (undergraduate and/or graduate) will be selected for the programs and **most costs (airfare, room, board, in-country travel) will be covered by the projects**. In some instances, students may work with the directors to apply for additional internal or external funding opportunities. Selection of students will be based on the completed application.
